


# DINOSAUR AND MAN

The word Behemoth, as referenced in the bible, is a term used in modern slang describing huge, massive things that are unmatched. What animal is this describing in the old testament? "Behold now Behemoth..." (Job 40:15-24 in the Bible.) God tells Job to behold this animal. God does not tell Job to behold something he cannot see. This is an animal that existed along with Job and his description is detailed in the old testament. Does the translation show an elephant, the largest land animal alive today? I don't think an elephant has a large tail like a cedar tree. Let's compare this image to the right. The translation in Genesis shows scriptural reference to a large reptilian animal, possibly the greatest land animal of all time, similar to the Titanosaurus that had a total length of roughly 85 feet with a weight of nearly 65 tons, or 130,000

## DESCRIPTION OF THE ANIMAL:

Of course, the majority of people today don't believe dinosaurs lived with man at the time of Job or anytime, so let's look at both sides:

Arguments against Behemoth being a dinosaur:

1. Behemoth could be poetic or symbolic — not describing a literal animal.
2. "Behemoth" likely refers to a known animal:  
Many scholars think Behemoth may be a poetic description of a hippopotamus or elephant.
3. Dinosaurs and humans didn't co-exist. Mainstream paleontology places dinosaurs' extinction at about 65 million years ago, long before humans appeared.
4. There is no other biblical or archaeological evidence.



Arguments for Behemoth being a dinosaur:

1. Tail like a cedar (Job 40:17): this suggests a massive, tree-like tail — similar to a sauropod dinosaur like Diplodocus or Apatosaurus. It contrasts sharply with modern animals like hippos or elephants, whose tails are relatively small.
2. Bones like "tubes of bronze" and "bars of iron" (Job 40:18):  
Descriptions of immense strength and durability seem to fit a massive, heavy creature like a large dinosaur.
3. First of the works of God (Job 40:19): Suggests Behemoth was among the most impressive land animals, which could imply something larger than anything alive today. Clearly we are on the side of the creationists. This as a stand alone argument would not be a slam dunk, but when combined with the following science, fossils, scriptures, and historical accounts, it is overwhelmingly convincing.
